

Player Profile: Jason Tatum

Jason Tatum is a professional basketball player for the Boston Celtics of the National Basketball Association (NBA). He was born on March 3, 1998, in St. Louis, Missouri. He played college basketball for the Duke Blue Devils.

Tatum was a McDonald's All-American in high school. He was also named the Gatorade National Player of the Year. In his freshman year at Duke, Tatum averaged 16 points and 7 rebounds per game. He was named to the All-ACC Freshman Team.

Tatum was drafted by the Boston Celtics with the third overall pick in the 2017 NBA draft. He made his NBA debut on October 17, 2017. In his rookie season, Tatum averaged 14 points and 5 rebounds per game. He was named to the NBA All-Rookie First Team.
