

Celtics beat the Heat in Game 5 of the Eastern Conference Finals

The Boston Celtics won Game 5 of the NBA Eastern Conference Finals against the Miami Heat, 110-97. The Celtics were led by Jayson Tatum, who scored 46 points. Jaylen Brown added 26 points for the Celtics. The Heat were led by Jimmy Butler, who scored 34 points.
